We are really excited to inform you that we will be changing our food provider at Grandpont. From Monday 3rd June 2019 we will be working with 'The School Lunch Company' to provide Grandpont children with delicious and home cooked meals, where the food is locally sourced.



We are currently working with them to agree a well balanced and nutritious menu and we are asking some parents to be involved in this process. The new company works very closely with a nutritionist to ensure children are receiving the right food types for their age and they have been very keen to support us knowing that we are providing meals for very young children.

As we develop our relationship with this new company we will be listening to their advice around what we also offer at tea and breakfast and there will be more information about what the menus look like soon.

We all appreciate that families find it hard to organise their lives around ill children and disrupted routines can be stressful but, please keep children at home until they are well enough to come back to nursery. If our staffing numbers drop too low then we could be in danger of not being able to meet the statutory requirements of staffing ratios.

If you have given your child some Calpol or other medication before arriving at Nursery, please can you let your child's key person know and what time you gave it, so they can monitor your child's health.
