School Streets- Some of you may have already heard that the Local Authority is proposing to implement the 'School Streets' scheme for Grandpont and St Ebbes in the coming weeks. What this means is that a barrier is likely to be in place, probably at the T junction with Whitehouse Road and Marlborough Road and vehicles will not be able to access the road beyond the barrier for drop off and collection times.



There has been a lot of consideration over the past few years on how to make Whitehouse Road a much safer place when children access it on their way to school and nursery. There are three main motivations that promote the need to run the safer streets program and these include; health benefits, road danger reduction and to promote independent mobility. A School Street is a road outside a school with a temporary restriction on motorised traffic at school drop-off and pick-up times. The restriction applies to

school traffic and through traffic. The result is a safer, healthier and pleasant environment for everyone.

School Street schemes offer a proactive solution for school communities to tackle air pollution, poor health and road danger reduction. A School Street scheme will encourage a healthier lifestyle and active travel to school for families and lead to a better environment for everyone.

The proposal is to start a scheme at the end of May, beginning of June and there is some discussion about alternative parking options for those people who really need to travel by car.

I will of course let you have more information as soon as I know more myself but I am keen that you are aware that this is an imminent possibility as some of you will need to consider how you will travel to drop your children off and pick up.

There will also be an opportunity for consultation further down the line.

Lunch box advice from the Local Authority- The LA has offered this guidance on packed lunches. As we expect our families to provide lunches at the moment I thought I would share this with you.

60 Second Lunchbox Hacks

In the 2020 Eat Them to Defeat Them survey of participating schools 36% reported an increase in vegetables in kids' packed lunches. Research tells us that fewer than two in every 100 packed lunches eaten in English primary schools meet nutritional standards and just one in five children had any vegetables or salad in their packed lunch.
